

Your District and County Councillor speak to the Police on a regular basis. They report instances reported to them as they occur and support residents who have specific issues to contact both the Police and Stratford District Council Anti-Social Behavior Team.

The Police would like to remind residents that they need to report any policing issues directly to them. A direct report from a resident is logged onto their database and builds evidence for resource to be applied to issues.

Social Media conversations do not contribute to this important database.

### **Points of contact: -**

#### **999**

This is the number to ring if there is an emergency incident happening right now that needs an immediate police presence – if life is at risk, people are injured, offenders are nearby or a crime is in progress.

#### **Reporting online**

This is the preferred method to contact police and report any non-emergency issues which do not require an immediate response.
