

# The Annual Meeting of the Alcester Town Council was held at 7.00pm on Tuesday 6<sup>th</sup> May 2025 at The Alcester War Memorial Town Hall, Alcester.

## 11. Mayoral and Deputy Mayoral Charity for 2025-2027
