After a Flood:

If you have been affected by a flood, there are a number of things to be aware of when cleaning up:

- 1. Contact your insurance company and register your claim.
- 2. Take photos or videos and make a list of everything that has been damaged.
- 3. Flood water could be contaminated or contain sharp objects, so always wear protective clothing, boots and rubber gloves when cleaning up.
- 4. Find out how to dispose of flood damaged items safely, after you have spoken to your insurance company.
- 5. Get your electricity checked by a qualified electrician before you turn it back on.

For advice after flooding:

In Warwickshire, flood recovery grants may be available to help individuals and businesses impacted by flooding, including grants for immediate recovery costs, council tax relief, and property flood resilience measures.

We all have responsibility to protect our own properties.

Local councils do not have a duty to provide sandbags to the wider public and do not carry stocks for general distribution. For advice on property protection measures see:

There are things you can do to reduce the impact of flooding by preparing in advance, such as:

- Have the correct home insurance policy in place.
- Prepare an emergency flood kit with items you may need if flooding means you can't access your home. Make sure you know how to quickly turn off your water, gas and electricity mains.
- Write a simple plan of how you would respond to a flood include emergency contact numbers, essential documents, medication and belongings you would need if you had to evacuate. A personal flood plan template has been provided with this leaflet.
- Keep your drains and gutters clear of leaves to help prevent blockages and localised flooding in heavy rainfall.

What to do during a flood

Flood water can rise quickly, so always focus on the safety of yourself and your family before your property and be prepared to act quickly.

If there is an immediate risk to life or you are trapped by flood water call 999.

In the event of an emergency or severe flooding, follow these steps to stay safe:

- Move your family and pets upstairs or to a high place with a means of escape.
- Move important items and documents upstairs or somewhere high and safe.
- Turn off gas, electricity and water supplies if flood water is about to enter your home.
- DO NOT touch any electrical appliances or cables when standing in flood water.
- If you are asked to evacuate, contact your insurance provider or landlord (if renting) as they may be able to provide temporary accommodation. Contact friends and family to see whether they can help. If you are unable to find alternative accommodation, contact Stratford-on-Avon-District Council on 01789 267575.
- Avoid walking in flood water.
